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TRANSCRIPTION

Jay Finnigan: I got to try to do multiple things. All right. First item we're missing so far, Ed Snyder, Reading Jr. Royals, and Wilmington Nighthawks.

Dan Rudd: Jay, I'm here. It's Dan.

Jay Finnigan: Dan, you snuck in, buddy. Sorry about that.

Dan Rudd: That's all right.

Jay Finnigan: All right. First item would be the approval of the agenda.

Ian Mackenzie: J.B.H.

Jay Finnigan: Is there a second?

Don Tweedy: Junior Pens.

Jay Finnigan: Any questions? Anyone opposed? Unanimous. Approval of the May 13th, 2026 minutes. Is there a motion?

Joe DiPiero: Chester County.

Stephane Charbonneau: No flowers.

Jay Finnigan: OK, any additions, deletions and corrections? Anyone opposed? Motion carries. Approval of May 2026 financial report and treasurer's report. Is there a motion?

Jamie Haslett: Quakers.

Jeff Grable: Huntsman.

Jay Finnigan: Any questions? Hearing none, unanimous. Reports, Mr. D'Angelo?

Joe D'angelo: I have nothing right now.

Jay Finnigan: Mr. Jackson?

Dave Jackson: Just start to upload all the information into a game sheet for the new season. Just waiting on the final.

Jay Finnigan: Mr. Sechuk?

Larry Sechuk: Yeah, Jay, I'm here. Just real quick, from a marketing standpoint and fundraising standpoint, we got a couple of new parties that are interested, and it's all due to supporting the DVHL financially, and that's due to the Iceworks connection here where we have some vendors that are very interested in supporting youth ice hockey. So I'm in conversations with them. And I'm hoping I, there's three of them and I hope I can get at least five grand from each one of them, but I'll keep you posted on how it's going. But we do have a lot of interesting people that want to participate in supporting us. So I'll keep you posted on how things develop.



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Jay Finnigan: Okay. Any questions for any of the board members?

Okay. While I was in Denver last week, I met with the president, executive director, or whatever the title is, of the CBHL. And they're interested in doing cross-scheduling with us where the opportunities arise. What I am doing is I am sending them our levels and our – schedulers so they can get in touch and schedule some games. And hopefully this will develop an ongoing relationship with them, similar to what we have with New Jersey youth. I know I talked to a couple of the organizations and they're interested in doing it. I look back when I first got involved in the DVHL program, There were teams actually in Maryland that were part of the DVHL, and we went down there to play games. So hopefully it will be able to help with additional games and help you with scheduling non-league games as well. The other thing that they want to do is schedule at end of the season kind of like a mini-tournament. They have four states. So they got Virginia, West Virginia, Maryland, and somewhere else. They want to send one team from each one of those states at the 12 AA level and do kind of like a DVHL, CBHL weekend. And I've tentatively scheduled that for February 27th and 28th of next year. That's assuming that Iceworks has ice available to do it that weekend. So, Stefan, I need you to look at that. It will be eight teams. And at the 12 AA, I'm going to need to get a commitment from Central Penn, Chester County, Quakers, and Snyder to participate in that. So if you could let me know pretty soon, because if any of the DVHL teams don't want to participate, I would go and see if I can get a New Jersey youth team to fill the slots for the DVHL teams. I think it'd be a good opportunity for us to start to cross-pollinate.

Anyone have questions, concerns, comments? It's gonna be quick.

Brian Peca: Hey, Jay, real quick. This is Brian.

So what would a crossover during the season look like in terms of like with the DVHL schedule?

I know you mentioned earlier, McCall, but I know you talked about the weekend at the end, but a crossover in season?

Jay Finnigan: In season so they can schedule like non-league games.

Brian Peca: Okay. All right. Yeah. Okay. Thank you.

Jay Finnigan: So, and he is also going to send me the list of their teams and their schedules. And as soon as I get that, I'm going to distribute it to the DVHL membership as well.

Brian Peca: Okay, guys. I just wanted to clarify from the scheduling standpoint. That's all. No, no problem.

Jay Finnigan: Okay. It appears that roster and background checks in the locker room monitors, if you remember last year, you had to fill in the roster, download a roster that Karen would send you, and you would then list the people on it.

Board and anyone in the organization that deals with or has the opportunity to deal with or interact with minors. It looks like USA Hockey is going to go to a certification that you would be required to file a document with Karen that your organization meets all the criteria required under the Pennsylvania Background Check Act. Similar to anything else, it is subject to audit by the district and by USA Hockey, if they so choose.

Stephane Charbonneau: Hey, Jay, I have a question. It's Stephane. Is there a bylaw with the DVHL for locker room monitors if it's a boys team, can only be a man to monitor? If it's a girls team, can only be a girls or woman? To the best of my knowledge, I do not believe it's in the rules and regulations.



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Jay Finnigan: Okay. But I would hope that common sense would prevail.

Stephane Charbonneau: I agree with you, but it's, yeah, yeah. It would be a lot easier for us coming from you guys than just us. You know what I mean?

Jay Finnigan: I can send that out in an email just so that...

The other thing I sent out a spreadsheet that shows the membership trend over the last three years. Brian and I sat in the membership council's meeting last week, and there is a lot of analysis and a dashboard being developed by USA Hockey that you can go in and query membership trends, membership all sorts of information. Hopefully it's gonna be rolled out by the end of the year. I was able to get some membership information and sent it to the organization so you can see your own trends for the last three years. Use it as you see fit. If there's anything the league can do to help you increase membership or the district, there's grants available. There's the Try Hockey for Free grants, equipment available through USA Hockey to get people in the door. So if you... Have any interest in those types of things. Get in touch with either Brian and myself. I know Brian has set down stuff on the, from the district standpoint as the growth coordinator. So. USA Hockey is really starting to be able to analyze membership, what's driving people into the game, what's driving people out of the game. I think it's some of the information that you have on top of you. That's the price of hockey. People are technically... Go away from the sport. Also, you get to the 14, 16-year-olds, they tend to either decide to continue to play or drop out of the sport altogether and you need to figure out a way to keep those that start at 10 and 12.

Brian Peca: So, Yeah, Jay, if I can jump in real quick. So I'll second what you were mentioning with the dashboard. It's certainly very interesting, the data. Definitely looking forward to diving into that at some point once we are able to see it.

If anyone did not get my email I sent back in May 28th, the tracking for free dates this year are October 3rd. And February 27th, 2027. So this October 3rd, 2026 and February 27th, 2027. You can obviously pick your own dates if you do the custom date. If you did not get my email, send me a note and I'll forward it over to you.

???: Hey, Jay, I do have a question. I know there's a new bylaws going to come out next year about players from Maryland not be able to play in our district. I know New York, Connecticut approved it. They let them play in our district, but Maryland's the only district set up, so are you not? I know that Glenn Heffren's going to have a waiver for it this year. Is DVHL involved with that too?

Jay Finnigan: Glenn has had conversations with the Potomac Valley individuals and the CBHL. There was a misunderstanding. I believe that they're working through that. And the same thing that's New York and Connecticut is going to be applicable down there. Karen Fund is handling that for the district because I know it affects the junior blue hens. And I've had emails back and forth with the blue hands. And as of last week in Denver, they seem to be moving towards an agreement because there appeared to be a misunderstanding or a misinterpretation of what the policy and rules were.

Ian Mackenzie: Got it. Thank you. So then, Jay, just real quick then from our perspective, JBH, is there anything that we need to do at the current time regarding this or are we good?

Jay Finnigan: No, you've got to contact Karen Fung with the information.

Ian Mackenzie: Okay. Got it. Thank you.

Jay Finnigan: Individuals, what I would do is the individuals, how long you've been in the organization and what level they're going to play at in the 26- 27 season.



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Ian Mackenzie: Got it. Thank you.

Jay Finnigan: Uh, scheduling matrix. Mike is not here. Spags is not here. So we got to figure out how many games we're going to play at each level. Uh, we'll start at the top 18U AA, is that all Brian? Is that already been figured out through the, MAHA

Brian Peca: As far as I know, the AA scheduling has started. Suzanne sent out the stuff to all the clubs that are involved in AA.

Stephane Charbonneau: Yeah, Brian, we did the schedule already for AA.

Jay Finnigan: Yeah. I just want to make sure. 18A, there are nine...

Brian Peca: Hey, Jay, real quick. Do you have the projections in front of you?

Jay Finnigan: Yeah.

Brian Peca: So we can just make sure we can see it.

Jay Finnigan: Hold on.

Stephane Charbonneau: Somebody's got to put their phone, their computer on mute.

Members: Larry. Larry. Larry.

Jay Finnigan: Yep. Okay. So at 18A National, I have Central Penn, Chester County, Delaware Junior Bluehens, Delco, Hershey, Quakers, Snyder, Susquehanna, and Wilkes-Barre. So there's nine teams. Home and away gets you 16 games, correct? Yeah. Do you want to do home and away plus one or just home and away?

Todd Kinkus: I would like to do home and away plus one to get to 24 there at that 18 A National level. Okay. Speaking on behalf of the junior blue hens.

Jay Finnigan: Anyone else have any input? Anyone?

Joe DiPiero: Joe from Chester County. I think 24 is the way to go.

Jay Finnigan: Anyone opposed to home and away plus one? Okay. 16A National I have Chester County, Flyers Youth, Hershey Junior Bears, Huntsman, Quakers, Stampede, and Wilkes-Barre.

Don Tweedy: Jay, it's Don from Wilkes-Barre. We're going to drop that team. We just couldn't get enough players. We only have nine players for that team, so we had to drop it.

Jay Finnigan: Okay, so now we have seven in there. Play each other three times.

Mike Schmelz: Yeah, Hershey.

Jay Finnigan: Three times. Anyone have any comments on that? All right. 16A American. I have Central Penn, Delco, Flyers Youth, Hershey Junior Bears, Huntsman, Quakers, Reading, Snyder. That's eight. Home and away plus one. Anyone opposed to home and away plus one? Anyone opposed to foot home and away plus one? Okay. 14 AA.



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Joe DiPiero: Jay, real quick. That 16A National, you said there's seven teams. They're going to play three times. How many game totals?

Brian Peca: With 8 teams, with 8 teams, it's 21 games.

Member: Yeah, I thought they said it was only six, though.

Don Tweedy: No, there's seven teams in there. Wilkes-Barre had to drop their team, so that gives you seven.

Brian Peca: So if it's three times, it's 18 games.

Jay Finnigan: Want to go four times?

Joe DiPiero: No, I'm cool with that. I just wanted to make sure I had this written down right.

Jay Finnigan: Okay. 14 AA is scheduling already. 14 A National.

Ian Mackenzie: Hey, Jay, did you forget 16 AA? Is that already being scheduled?

Jay Finnigan: Yes. Yeah, okay. It's already being scheduled.

Ian Mackenzie: All right, got it. Thanks.

Jay Finnigan: So 14 A National, there's 12 teams. Chester County, Blue Hands, Delco has two, Hershey, Huntsman, Lakers, Reading, Snyder, Susquehanna, Wilmington, and Wilkes-Barre. I think, yeah, Wilkes-Barre. 12 teams home and away is... - 22. - 22. Everyone okay with home and away?

Members: Yep. - Yep. -

Jay Finnigan: 14B, eight teams, Central Penn, Chester County, Blyers Youth. Hatfield, Huntsman, Quakers, Wilkes-Barre, and Princeton. Brian, that team's still in there, right?

Brian Peca: Correct. 12B is not for Ice Hawks, but I told that to Joe back in May.

Jay Finnigan: Remind me when we get to 12B.

Brian Peca: Yeah, that's fine. No problem.

Jay Finnigan: 14 A Americans. I mean, 14 B national. Excuse my language.

Brian Peca: So what's your total? How many teams? I'm trying to see you're at the bottom.

Jay Finnigan: Eight teams. So if you play each other home and away, plus one, it's 21 games.

Brian Peca: Which is a good number for that level.



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Jay Finnigan: Everyone okay with that? I'll take no comment as a good comment. 12A National, Blue Hens, Flyers Youth, Hershey Jr. Bears, Huntsman, Reading, and Snyder. Six teams. Out of three times as well or four times?

Ian Mackenzie: I kind of want to go four, right? Because three is what? 15 games?

Jay Finnigan: Right.

Members: Yeah, I think four there. I agree too. Yeah, four.

Jay Finnigan: Okay. 12 UA American.

Member: Jay, are we positive the New Jersey teams are going to be willing to play a full schedule? Traditionally, they do not.

Jay Finnigan: Based on what conversations Joe has had with them, yes, but I will confirm that with Mr. Spagnuolo again tomorrow.

Thank you.

Jay Finnigan: No problem. 12 UA American. There are 12 teams. Central Penn, Chester County, Blue Hens, Delco with two, Hershey, Huntsman with two, Wackers, Susquehanna, and Wilkes-Barre and Princeton.

Todd Kinkus: J.B.H. Is a B team at that level, or that's our second team there.

Jay Finnigan: Okay, hold on. So this one goes over?

Todd Kinkus: Yeah, correct, to the 12B National day.

Jay Finnigan: Okay. So that's 12 teams then. Right 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11. Home and away.

Joe D'angelo: Home and away.

Jay Finnigan: Home and away.

Ian Mackenzie: Yeah, that's what 20 games, right?

Jay Finnigan: Yep,

Member: sounds good.

Jay Finnigan: 12 B National. Chester County, Junior Bluehens, Flyers Youth, Hatfield is out, right?

Brian Peca: It is for 12B, yes. Yeah, we announced that back in early May.

Jay Finnigan: Huntsman, Little Flyers, Quakers, Wilkes-Barre. That gives us one, two, three, five, seven. Three times?

Member: Yeah. Home and away plus one.

Dave Jackson: So it's at home and away plus one. Were we doing three times?



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Jay Finnigan: Yeah, home and away and plus one is not the same as three times. So if I'm three times there, I'm home and away plus one.

Ian Mackenzie: What? Home and away plus one would give you 21 games, right? No. Am I doing that right? 18 games. Sorry.

Jay Finnigan: 18 games. Three times would give you 21.

Ian Mackenzie: I would say three times.

Jay Finnigan: 10A National. 10A National. Central Penn, Chester County, Delco, YSU, Hershey, Huntsman, Reading, Snyder, Susquehanna, Princeton. That's 10 teams. Home and away. Anyone opposed to home and away? Home and away plus one.

Joe D'angelo: Home and away plus one.

Jay Finnigan: Anyone opposed to go ahead? Home and away plus one.

Joe D'angelo: Yep.

Jay Finnigan: 10 A American is Central Penn, Chester County, Blue Hens, Quakers with two, Snider with one, Wilmington with one Wilkes-Barre with one Princeton with two. That's 10. So it's the moment away plus one.

Joe D'angelo: Yeah.

Jay Finnigan: 10B is Central Penn, Chester County, Delco, Delaware Junior Blue Hens, Flyers youth, Huntsman, Little Flyers, Quakers, Reading, Princeton, home and away plus one same as the others? I'll get these to Mike and he'll send the matrix out. Now, the other thing is, let me bring this other document up.

Jeff Grable: Hey, Jay, before you move on, can you go back to that sheet?

Jay Finnigan: Hold on. You see it?

Jeff Grable: Yeah, U16. You have the Huntsman one in the wrong line. That's all. Just move it down one. On U16, what is that? A American. Sure, it's that right there? Bring it down one line. There you go. Done.

Jay Finnigan: Okay.

Jeff Grable: Thank you, sir.

Brian Peca: Hey Jay, this is Brian real quick. Once you send it over to Mike and Mike puts this together, if you guys want me to, I'll put it in Google.com again like I did last year so it's just easier for the schedulers to access and go off of. I think everybody likes that format.

Jay Finnigan: Sounds good.

Stephane Charbonneau: Yeah, that was nice, Brian.

Brian Peca: No problem.



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Jay Finnigan: All right, one other document I want to bring up here. It's not closing. You'll find it. Can you see the DVHL season now?

Ian Mackenzie: Yep.

Jay Finnigan: Okay. So I did what the membership wanted to split the playoffs on two weekends. The first weekend, I have 18 AA, 16 AA, 14 AA, 12 AA, and 10 AA. To make it easier on Stephane with scheduling, I was going to move 18s and 16s on to that weekend, 18A, 16 A National and 16 A American and then do all the others on the second weekend, which is February 19th through the 21st. Is that okay with everyone?

Brian Peca: Hey, Jay, just real quick. For 10 and 12 AA, for the Alliance, the playoffs are going through New Jersey. Now, obviously, for 12 AA, that would be district bound, so you have to do something separate for that.

Jay Finnigan: Right. But we're going to want to do it for our own anyway. And the dates don't conflict with their playoffs as well.

Brian Peca: Okay. Yeah, makes sense. Sure.

Joe DiPiero: Hey, Jay, just not to jump back too far. When are we going to start scheduling these games?

Jay Finnigan: As soon as Mike can get the matrix done. Hopefully, I will. By next Wednesday, I would hope. Up to Mike and Brian, once they get that stuff in there, then we can go ahead and schedule. The sooner the better.

Brian Peca: I mean, Jay, if you send me this tonight, I'll do it. I'm not trying to step on Mike's toes at all, but I can do it.

Jay Finnigan: All right. Let me just confirm everything with Joe Spaggs, and then I'll get it over to you, Brian.

Brian Peca: Sure. No problem.

Jay Finnigan: So does anyone have a problem with moving those three, the 18, 16A National and 16A American to the first weekend?

Ian Mackenzie: So that would be 18A and then the two 16A teams, right?

Jay Finnigan: 16A National and 16A American. Okay.

Ian Mackenzie: No, I mean, I don't have a problem with it from a JBH perspective.

Jay Finnigan: The 14, 12s and 10s on the following weekend.

Ian Mackenzie: No, I think it's fine from my perspective. And if the three, excuse me, the four 12As, 12AAs can get to me by Friday if you want to participate in that end of season event. With CBHL and that would be February 27th through 28th at Iceworks.

Jay Finnigan: Stephane, can you see if that works please?

Stephane Charbonneau: It works.

Jamie Haslett: Jay, it's Jamie from Quakers. Will there be an extra cost for that?

Jay Finnigan: I hope to absorb it.



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Jamie Haslett: Okay, thank you.

Jay Finnigan: Hopefully we can use some of Larry's money. No pressure, Larry. If not, I can also try for a grant from the district. I just need that commitment so I can start that ball right now. If not, Jamie, I'll come up with something that it's minimal from the organizations. What Stephane with. Eight teams, how many games can you get in during that weekend?

Stephane Charbonneau: I can get as many as we need, Jay. Fairly simple.

Jay Finnigan: Okay.

Stephane Charbonneau: Let's hope we have our rinks back, yeah.

Jay Finnigan: They're not back up yet?

Stephane Charbonneau: No.

Jay Finnigan: What's the prognosis?

Stephane Charbonneau: I don't know yet, 100%.

Jay Finnigan: Okay. I think we want to talk offline. It's not going to be like down for two years, is it?

Stephane Charbonneau: No. Two years? Jesus Christ.

Jay Finnigan: Just trying to help these other organizations. Anyone have anything else?

Joe D'angelo: Hey, Jay. Rizzo's asking about, he's texting me about might information. I mean, this is his first year back on when we schedule and stuff like that for the mites.

Jay Finnigan: Well, if you see in the matrix here, I asked Joe for the dates. I don't have the dates. Stephane, do you know when the mite jamboree is?

Stephane Charbonneau: Yeah, we had a two-year agreement. It's September 10th, 11th, 12th, whatever that weekend because Labor Day is late this year.

Jay Finnigan: So it's September 11th, 12th?

Stephane Charbonneau: Whatever that's Saturday and Sunday, yeah. The weekend after Labor Day.

Jay Finnigan: 12th and 13th.

Stephane Charbonneau: Yeah. I told Joe that like a couple weeks ago.

Jay Finnigan: I... Good question. So September 12th and 13th, right?

Stephane Charbonneau: Yep.

Jay Finnigan: OK, and the season usually begins.



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Stephane Charbonneau: For the mites in November

Jeff Grable: November 1st, usually.

Jay Finnigan: It's going to get a date. So be November 7th. Which is this first Saturday? OK. Mr. Grable? Jeff?

Jeff Grable: Yeah.

Jay Finnigan: And you're going to do the end of the season mic thing as well?

Jeff Grable: Yeah, I'll give you the dates. It's usually around March 15th we do it. So don't put anything in there yet. I'll give it to you.

Jay Finnigan: Okay. Joe, I let Rizzo rink in three times. I don't know what happens.

Joe D'angelo: He was in. I saw him.

Jay Finnigan: Steve, are you still in?

Steve Rizzo: I'm here. Did you lose me?

Jay Finnigan: No, I just don't. So you have those dates?

Steve Rizzo: Yeah, I wrote them down. I was writing them down on the sheet. I had printed it out.
